

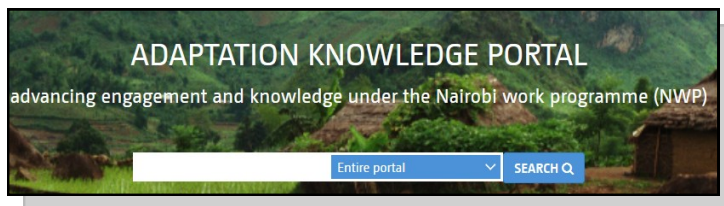

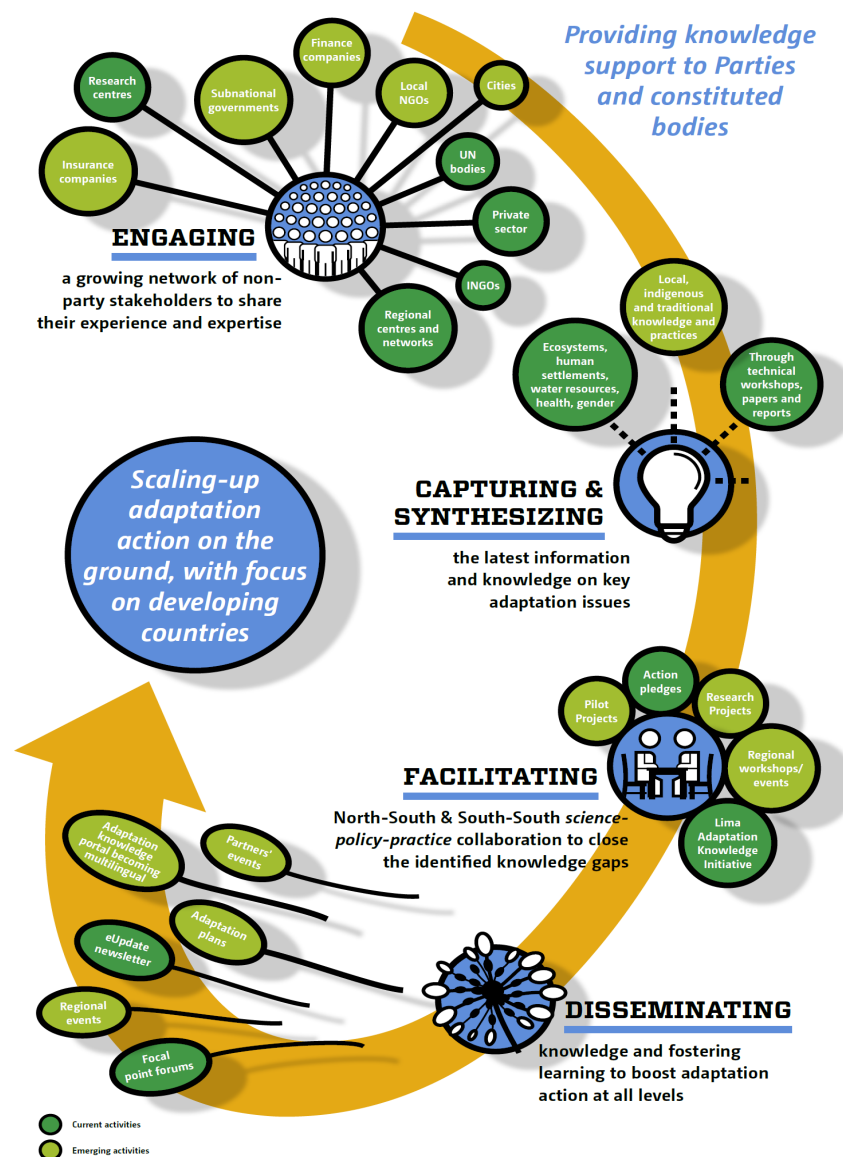

What are the new mandates of the Nairobi work programme in the field of human health?

Invitation to Parties, NWP partner organizations and other relevant organizations to submit, **by 29 August 2016**, information on: their **recent work in the area of climate impacts on human health**, including changes in the geographic distribution of diseases; **new and emerging health issues**, including tropical diseases and their impacts on social and economic structures, as well as the **issues of malnutrition, waterborne diseases, vector-borne diseases and disaster impacts**; and the effects of climate change on health and productivity in the work place, with implications for **occupational health, safety and social protection**.
