**TOPIC:** NEW COLLECTIVE QUANTIFIED GOAL ON CLIMATE FINANCE

**WORK PLAN 2024** 

#### MANDATE(S)

Decision 1/CP.21: '[The COP] also decides that, in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 3, of the Agreement, developed countries intend to continue their existing collective mobilization goal through 2025 in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency on implementation; prior to 2025 the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement shall set a new collective quantified goal from a floor of USD 100 billion per year, taking into account the needs and priorities of developing countries;

Decision 14/CMA.2: '[The CMA] decides to initiate at its third session (November 2020), in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 3, of the Paris Agreement, deliberations on setting a new collective quantified goal from a floor of USD 100 billion per year in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency of implementation and taking into account the needs and priorities of developing countries;

Agrees to consider, in its deliberations referred to in paragraph 1 above, the aim to strengthen the global response to the threat of climate change in the context of sustainable development and efforts to eradicate poverty, including by making finance flows consistent

Decision X/CMA.5, Paragraph 13" '[The CMA] Invites Parties to submit views on issues to be addressed as part of the 2024 workplan referred to in paragraph 12(a) above via the submission portal4 by 31 January 2024'

## **VIEWS**

## NCQG AHWP WORK PLAN FOR 2024

AOSIS welcomes this opportunity to present its views on issues to be addressed as part of the 2024 work plan for the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate Finance ('NCQG') ad-hoc work programme. This submission should be read in conjunction with the AOSIS NCQG Submission dated 6th March 2022 and the positions contained therein.

### PRELIMINARY MATTERS

AOSIS reiterates that the decision of the CMA that transitions the NCQG deliberation process under its Ad-Hoc Work Programme 'to a mode of work to enable the development of a draft negotiating text for consideration of the CMA'<sup>1</sup> does not set a precedent for other processes. Beside the CMA itself, only a subsidiary body established pursuant to Article 16(4)(a) of the Paris Agreement by the CMA has the legitimacy to 'make, within its mandate, the decisions necessary to promote its effective implementation'.<sup>2</sup> Furthermore, these meetings of the NCQG ad-hoc work programme ('AHWP') do not fall within the definition of a subsidiary body established pursuant to Article 16(4)(a) the Paris Agreement.

AOSIS emphasises that in this 'mode of work' transition, the role of the Co-Chairs of the NCQG AHWP is to capture progress by including a 'substantive framework for a draft negotiating text'<sup>3</sup> in its annual report. Said framework must has taken into consideration, *inter alia*, Party submissions from 2022-2024, views from AHWP meetings, and work from TEDs. The aforementioned report is produced under their authority as Co-Chairs for consideration of the CMA.<sup>4</sup> The ultimate authority to continue deliberations and set the NCQG remains with the CMA at its 2024 session.<sup>5</sup>

AOSIS looks forward to constructively engaging in this process (especially in the AHWP meeting) and continues to advocate for full, effective, equal participation of all Parties, especially small island developing States, in said meetings. This should include funding for the participation of at least one (1) representative from each eligible developing country Party to all TEDs and AHWP meetings. Additionally, it should be noted that while options for virtual participation can increase inclusivity through allowing additional national experts to participate, virtual participation does not afford Parties an equal opportunity for engagement when compared to in-person participation. Virtual participation is, therefore, not a substitute for ensuring equitable and equal in-person attendance of all Parties.

#### INDICATIVE STRUCTURE

AOSIS proposes the following indicative structure for purposes of the first order draft of a substantive framework for the draft negotiation text capturing progress without prejudice to the final structure of the NCQG:

- Temporal Scope and Frequency of Measurement: An annual quantum floor of climate finance over a 10 years' time period representing climate finance that developed country Parties are obligated to provide and mobilize for climate action in developing country Parties in the context of their implementation of the Paris Agreement,
- **Substantive Scope:** Sub-goals aligned to Article 9, including in particular Article 9, paragraph 4 to ensure that:
  - all Parties collectively and effectively accelerate their pursuit of efforts of limiting the global average temperature increase to below 1.5 C within this critical decade
  - developing countries have increased abilities to adapt and foster climate resilience to the worst-case projected temperature scenario
  - developing countries are able to address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change to the worst-case projected temperature scenario
- Quantum, quality and access features under each sub-goal
- Sources of funding in accordance with Article 9 of the Paris Agreement
- Transparency arrangements: Based on, at minimum, the enhanced transparency framework, in particular its framework for transparency of support, and, an agreed definition of climate finance
