

SUBMISSION BY THE GOVERNMENT OF INDONESIA

In line with paragraph 9 of document FCCC/PA/CMA/2024/L.23, the Government of the Republic of Indonesia share its views on proposed topics for the 2025 global dialogues under the Sharm el-Sheikh Mitigation Work Programme.

General views:

- 1. Indonesia emphasize that the work programme must be facilitative, non-prescriptive, and non-punitive respecting national sovereignty and avoiding new targets beyond NDCs.
- 2. The dialogue should address cross-cutting issues to enhance mitigation ambition, actions, and support for developing countries while delivering co-benefits.
- 3. Indonesia urge to focus on major NDC mitigation actions, prioritizing implementation, solutions for developing countries, and translating commitments into policy action.

Proposed Thematic Areas:

Indonesia proposes the following topics for consideration at the 2025 Global Dialogue to strengthen mitigation efforts and ensure contributions from all sectors toward global climate goals:

- 1. The Role of Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency in Achieving a Low-Emission, Affordable Energy System Implementation renewable energy and efficiency measures is key to a low-emission, cost-effective energy system across power, buildings, industry and transport. Sharing best practices can help overcome technical, financial, and institutional challenges, accelerating mitigation progress.
- 2. Mitigation Actions in Marine and Coastal Areas

Enhancing mitigation in marine and coastal areas supports sustainable development, livelihoods and their critical role as greenhouse gas sinks and reservoirs, aligning with the Ocean and Climate Change Dialogue.
