Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

In light of the ongoing consultation on the “Five-Year Vision” of the Marrakech Partnership and the Climate High-Level Champions, TREEO — as a provider of verified, nature-based CO2 removal solutions with measurable social impact — welcomes the opportunity to contribute our perspective. Drawing on our experience in delivering digitally monitored, science-based climate solutions in collaboration with local communities, we respectfully submit the following recommendations and specific inputs for consideration in shaping the future development and effectiveness of the GCAA.

1. What should success look like for the GCAA in the next five years, and how can it be measured effectively?

- Adoption of standardized, science-based impact metrics, including precise, digital tracking of CO2 removals at the individual asset level (e.g., single-tree-level monitoring).
- Encouragement, development, and recognition of new standards that build on digital solutions and high transparency, enabling adaptive and innovative approaches to overcome well-known MRV challenges.
- Transparent, interoperable reporting platforms consolidating progress data from Parties and Non-Party Stakeholders (NPS), enabling independent verification.
- Social impact indicators alongside environmental metrics, tracking equitable benefit-sharing with local communities.
- Regular, publicly accessible progress dashboards aligned with key milestones of the Global Stocktake (GST), NDCs, and NAPs.

2. How can the GCAA facilitate direct and impactful engagement between Parties and NPS to support implementation efforts at both national and sectoral levels, in order to advance the full delivery of the GST, NDCs, and NAPs?

- Establish digital collaboration hubs within the GCAA ecosystem that connect Parties and NPS based on sectoral or regional priorities, enabling real-time data sharing, joint monitoring, and coordination of climate actions.
- Promote co-designed projects where Parties support NPS — especially local farming and forestry communities — with technical assistance and access to transparent market mechanisms.
- Encourage sector-specific working groups that integrate multi-stakeholder inputs, facilitating alignment with national policies and international commitments.
- Foster capacity-building programs focused on digital tools, MRV innovation, and impact measurement to enable local actors' meaningful contribution to national climate targets.

3. How can the GCAA promote an inclusive and equitable engagement, in particular from underrepresented groups and regions?

- Prioritizing funding and technical support for projects led by indigenous peoples, women, youth, and marginalized communities, ensuring these groups have direct decision-making power.
- Implementing transparent, participatory feedback mechanisms that allow underrepresented stakeholders to influence agenda-setting and program design within GCAA initiatives.
- Facilitating multilingual communication and culturally sensitive outreach to overcome barriers faced by diverse regions and groups.
- Establishing minimum thresholds for representation within governance bodies and working groups of the GCAA.

4. What improvements can be made to ensure better transparency, reporting, and follow-up of the GCAA, including in existing tools?

- Integrate interoperable data standards across GCAA reporting platforms to enable consolidated views of action progress and impact verification.
- Encourage and recognize new, adaptive standards grounded in digital solutions and transparency to improve MRV integrity.
- Incorporate real-time dashboards with open access to emission reduction data, social co-benefits, and project financial flows to increase stakeholder confidence.
- Mandate regular independent audits of GCAA-reported data and outcomes to verify accuracy and drive learning.
- Strengthen feedback loops by providing systematic mechanisms for stakeholders to comment on progress reports and for the GCAA to report on how feedback influences strategy evolution.
