First, thanks for the call for input for way forward.

Our suggestion relates to Food Security, Food productivity, food for hungry millions.

We suggest the following:

The experts may first assess current status and future projection on what will be likely situation and what can be done to meet the challenges by international cooperation under umbrella of UNFCCC.

In our opinion following is current status:

1. Adverse intense weather events are on increasing with increased temperature.

This will continue with further rapid rate and affect every one, everywhere.

But most vulnerable are local - rural areas where livelihoods are under danger.

Maximum impact is on agriculture sector - farming, livestock and fisheries.

Again, most vulnerable are developing countries and Ocean Areas.

- 2. This will pause serious challenges:
 - a. Migration within and outside
 - b. Social conflict and riots for food
 - c. Serious decline in productivity of agriculture, livestock and fisheries.
- 3. With increasing urbanisation, demand for food will increase and in years to come not met with.
